- We undertake annual safety conferences for our staff, contractors and trainees
- We have completed 320 behavioural safety workshops for our staff and contractors

- Focussing on our health monitoring programmes and putting in place plans to minimise those areas highlighted that impact on our staff
- Ensuring we continue to meet our legal obligations to our staff in regard to their health
